Course Description

This course analyses the development of Quebec since Confederation. It looks at the political, cultural, economic, social, and ideological factors that have shaped Quebec society from 1867 to the present. This course includes the following topics: the economic development, the transformation of the political culture, immigration and its impact on society, the evolution of nationalism and the rise of the independence movement, the role of the Roman Catholic Church as a political and cultural force, the place of Quebec within Canada, its relations with other provincial governments and territories and francophone minority groups, and the role of Quebec government in the world.
